







Today we are going to look at the work of two historians from ancient Greece.

They weren't just writing for readers at the time, but for future generations too. They wanted to share useful lessons for the future and so their work focuses on not forgetting important things over time.




What is a **proem**?

A proem is like an introduction.

In the first paragraph of their work, ancient historians usually present themselves and their work to the readers.

They *explain their aims* and what is significant and distinctive about their take on history writing.



What about the present?

- The Histories of Herodotus and Thucydides talk about wars that took place in times and societies that are different from the world we live in today.
- But, both texts are still influential today.
- They have inspired modern historians, political philosophers, authors of historical fiction, artists, and public debate on social media, such as X (formerly Twitter).
- Leonidas at Thermopylae and the Spartans continue to inspire today as symbols of **bravery**, **sacrifice** for a good cause, and **masculinity**.
